A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I have been thinking about seconds.

It started as I began to consider the seconds that come after firsts, not the seconds that tick off a clock. We have just finished the second decade of the second millennium. We have come to the second month of the year 2020. This is my second letter of the year.

It is strange how different the significance of seconds can be. Much of the time a "second" is something good—upbeat, positive, even wonderful—a second honeymoon, a second chance, a second piece of the best homemade pie in town.

Other times it is totally the reverse—factory seconds signify something flawed or otherwise of inferior quality. Taking a course for a second time suggests something that was failed the first time. A second notice of a past due bill suggests financial stress.

Twenty years ago I had surgery on my vocal cords and was told I would have to have a second surgery. I began to consider how I should interpret that. Was that a remedial sort of second?—suggesting that either the surgeon or I had not gotten it right the first time, so we would have to do it all over again. Was it a message from God, telling me—"There are more lessons I want you to learn from your surgery"? If it was a divine message, was God remembering all the weeks I had had to keep silent before surgery and during my recovery and saying, "You have not yet learned enough about silence so I am going to have to give you a second chance to get it right"? Or was God, perhaps, sending me an affirmative message—letting me know that I had done so well in the first round that I could take a second lesson as a graduate course in silence and continue to build on my lessons while they were still fresh in my mind. (What the second surgery actually meant was that I had a polyp on both of my vocal cords. Each polyp had to have its own surgery to keep the cords from fusing together as they healed.)

Unless you know the context, it is hard to guess whether seconds are a blessing or a curse.

With that in mind, what would it signify if I could offer you 86,400 seconds? Would that be a good thing or something to avoid?

As a matter of, fact you will have a gift of 86,400 seconds this year, although I will not be the one to give them to you.

This time I am talking about the other kind of seconds—the seconds that tick off a clock, not the seconds that come after firsts.

On Saturday, February 29th you will receive the gift of an entire extra day—twenty-four additional hours—1,440 "leap" minutes—86,400 bonus seconds.

Have you given any thought to how you might use such a rich gift?

Will you devote all those extra seconds to ordinary work? Will you do something special with them? Will you give them as a present to your family? Will you fritter them away?

Why not consider giving 10% of that time as a tithe to God? That is about two and a half hours. It is time enough to do a special chore for a neighbor who could use a hand. It is time enough to make a meal for someone who is ill or lonely. It is time enough to spend a couple of hours with your Bible. It is time enough to make sure that those "seconds" accomplish something upbeat, positive, even wonderful.

Don't give God your second best on leap year day (or any day). Give God the best seconds of that extra day you are being given this year.

After all you will not have a second chance to use these seconds after they are gone.

From the American Heart
Association: Cardiac arrest and heart attack are
not the same. A cardiac arrest is triggered by an
electrical malfunction in the heart that causes an
irregular heartbeat (arrhythmia). With its pumping
action disrupted, the heart can't pump blood to
the brain, lungs and other organs. Seconds later,
a person becomes unresponsive, is not breathing
or is only gasping. Death occurs within minutes if
the victim does not receive treatment.

Cardiac arrest can be reversible in some victims if treated within a few minutes. First call 911 and start CPR right away. If an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is available (we have one at church in the kitchen by the phone), use it as soon as possible. Cardiac arrest affects thousands of people annually. A heart attack occurs when blood flow to the heart is blocked. A blocked artery prevents oxygen-rich blood from reaching a section of the heart. If the blocked artery is not reopened quickly, the part of the heart normally nourished by that artery begins to die.

Symptoms of a heart attack may be immediate and may include intense discomfort in the chest or other parts of the upper body, shortness of breath, cold sweats, and/or nausea/vomiting, back or jaw pain. More often symptoms start slowly and persist for hours, days or weeks before a heart attack. Unlike with cardiac arrest, the heart usually does not stop beating during a heart attack. The longer the person goes without treatment, the greater the damage. Call 911 to get the most immediate care and follow up treatment in the emergency room (ER).

Most heart attacks do not lead to cardiac arrest. But when cardiac arrest occurs, heart attack is a common cause. Other conditions may also disrupt the heart's rhythm and lead to cardiac arrest.

More information will be given to you in the annual report.




